

About the project

All over Europe, young people are spending more and more time online, thus the consumption of media is increasing accordingly. However, many people are proving to be ill-equipped with skills to filter out and sort this growing intake of information, making a promising opportunity ineffective, and sometimes even harmful. This is why there is an ever so great need for competences allowing young people to navigate themselves around the wild waters of the Internet and media, recognise content of value, and distinguish fake news.

Even so, such media-literacy skills are generally not taught in public schools, that is why the aim of the project is to enable youth workers with tools to educate young people they work with to become more conscious users of the Internet and consumers of media. We strive to provide the participants with useful techniques – within the framework of non-formal education – to promote and enhance critical thinking, and to raise awareness of media-literacy.



Venue

The training will take place in Szeged, Hungary. The city is located in the Southern Great-Plains region in Hungary, it takes 2 hours by train to get to from the Airport of Budapest.



The accommodation for the participants will be in gender based rooms with 2-3-4 separated beds and bathrooms, located at a comfortable walking distance from the city centre. The meeting room where most of the activities will take place will be right in the hotel.

Travel and reimbursement

There is no participation fee. Food and accommodation (during the activity program) will be covered by the Erasmus+ grant.

Reimbursement

Travel reimbursements can only be made by bank transfer to the Partner Organization and based on real costs. The bank transfer will be executed after

- receiving all of the **original documents** (receipts, invoices, boarding passes) by post,
- filling the evaluation form generated by the European Commission online evaluation you will receive via email after the project,
- sending proof of **dissemination of results**.

up to the budget limit in Erasmus+ Programme.

Rules for reimbursement:

1. Only the cheapest means of transportation will be accepted between the country of the Partner Organization and the venue. **Before purchasing anything**, please, send your travel plan to fugg.zsanett@gmail.com for confirmation and consultation. We will not reimburse any costs that were not approved by us. Participants will be reimbursed on the basis of the least expensive route.

Please, keep in mind that **we do not accept invoices of taxis or from travel agencies** (e.g. skyscanner, momondo, kiwi, etc.), tickets should be purchased directly through the service providing companies' websites (i.e. flight tickets through the airlines' websites, train tickets through the railways' websites, bus tickets through the websites of the bus companies).

2. **You are expected to arrive on the 13th of March and leave on the 21st of March, 2023.** Only uninterrupted travel expenses incurred within 2 days before or after the activity start and end dates can be accepted for reimbursement. The travel days are the 13th and the 21st of March, but if you wish to stay in Hungary for longer and you find tickets for the same or lower value with those on the actual travel dates, then you can travel on the 11th of March or on the 23rd of March as well (once you get confirmation from us). However, if you decide to arrive earlier or stay longer (up to 2 days), all costs related to that (food or accommodation for those days) is not covered by the project.

3. The **reimbursement will be done** via bank transfer **after the receipt of all original travel documents** including boarding passes **by regular post**. The bank transfers costs cannot be covered by the project.

4. In order to avoid unnecessary stress and problems (e.g. loss of documents by the post) please send us **scanned copies of all documents by email** to fugg.zsanett@gmail.com **before sending those by post**. The address will be provided during the training course. Please note, that no scanned document will be reimbursed if the original hard copy is not provided as well.

5. In case a participant fails to engage in the activity's daily program due to late arrival or early departure and not attending 100% of the sessions, the amount granted per participant per day will be deducted from the travel reimbursement. The maximum limit to be reimbursed for each participant is highlighted above and was calculated by the distance calculator of the European Commission.

Other Costs

If participants decide to arrive earlier or stay longer, all costs related to that will be supported by the participants themselves.

Costs of the insurance are not eligible and will not be reimbursed! This means that each participant must support his/her own insurance that covers: travel insurance (including damage or loss of luggage) wherever relevant; accident and serious illness (including permanent or temporary incapacity); and death (including repatriation expenses), as defined in the ERASMUS+ Programme Guide.

European Health Insurance Card

The European Health Insurance Card is free card that gives you access to medically necessary, state-provided healthcare during a temporary stay in any of the 28 EU countries, Iceland, Lichtenstein, Norway and Switzerland, under the same conditions and at the same cost (free in some countries) as people insured in that country.
